On September 14th, the Sharing Center marked 4 decades of dedicated work toward serving Western Kenosha County. The Road to the 40th-anniversary event was attended by 300 supporters and non-profit partners, where the beautiful views of Wilmot Ski Resort provided a stunning backdrop for the evening. We recognized the continued efforts of our team and celebrated the milestone occasion with gourmet food vendors, a whiskey and cigar lounge, raffles, and entertainment.

During the event, the Trevor Fire Department Association was honored for their outstanding contribution of \$50,000. Moreover, the Center made a significant announcement of our own: the purchase of the building previously owned by the Fire Department. With this purchase, we look forward to the expansion of the facility in our endeavors to become a comprehensive hub for Western Kenosha County residents.

MEETING THE GROWING NEEDS

With economic challenges on the rise, the Sharing Center's employees and volunteers have been working diligently to connect visitors with the appropriate resources and services. Unfortunately, the unique difficulties of the present day have led to a continued increase in demand.



Last year, our generous donors provided 549 children with warm clothing, shoes, boots, coats, blankets, and other gifts that touched their hearts, minds, bodies, and souls. We were also able to provide more than 1800 holiday meals. However, if the trend of the last six months continues, we anticipate a 25% increase in need.

PARTNERSHIP TO ENHANCE VARIETY OF HEALTHY FOOD OPTIONS

The Sharing Center has implemented new food initiatives to assist those with dietary restrictions. Our commitment to health has led us to collaborate with Aurora Health Care, Food For Health and UW Extension Madison.

We now accommodate those with diabetes, gluten intolerance, vegan, vegetarian and heart disease by providing versatile items to create meals at home. The Sharing Center has also expanded our ethnic food offerings providing ingredients used in Eastern European, Asian, Indian and Hispanic homes.
